PRO SE DIVORCE PROVE-UP

May it please the court:

My name is _____.

I am presently married to _____.

Prior to filing for divorce, either myself or my spouse have been a domiciliary of Texas for the preceding six-month period and a resident of this county for the preceding ninety-day period.

I was married to my spouse on __/__/__, and we ceased to live together as husband and wife on or about __/__/__.

There is no reasonable expectation of reconciliation.

There are/are not any court-ordered conservatorships, guardianships, or other court-ordered relationships affecting these children.

The children do/do not own any property.

My spouse and I are presenting a proposed final parenting plan to the court that is contained in our proposed final decree of divorce.

My spouse and I think that the proposed parenting plan is in the best interest of our children, and ask the court to approve our proposed parenting plan.

My spouse and I have entered into an agreement concerning the division of our community property and debts. We think that the agreement is fair and equitable to both of us.

I am tendering to the Court a document entitled Agreed Decree of Divorce, which bears the signatures of both myself and my spouse.

I (or my spouse) am asking for a name change. The request for a name change is not to avoid creditors or criminal prosecution.

I am asking the court to grant a divorce and approve all the agreements entered into.
