



GALVESTON COUNTY LANDLORD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM:  
SINGLE FAMILY RENTAL  
NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

The Galveston County Landlord Assistance Program is now accepting applications from landlords. The rental unit/property must be located within Galveston County, outside the city limits of the City of Galveston.

Financial assistance for this program is made available to landlords through the Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery Program to provide safe, sanitary and secure housing for low to moderate income renters. Landlords may apply for assistance for the rehabilitation and reconstruction to receive assistance of up to four rental units.

In the effort to Affirmatively Further Fair Housing properties must fall outside of a target area to be eligible. Property addresses can be verified at <http://gis.glo.state.tx.us/hop/index.html>. Rental allocations for the Round 2 Rental Program must meet the current Rental Needs Assessment Houston-Galveston Area Council\_05-14-14 or the most recent published assessment.

The Galveston County Landlord Assistance Program will assist property owners with inquiries regarding application status, requirements for completing the application process, securing the required documentation and to schedule appointments at the Intake Center located at the Galveston County Courthouse, 722 Moody Avenue (21st St), 6th floor.

Property owners must be able to show proof that he or she currently owns or has ownership interest in the property.

Eligibility is restricted to properties in which **all** of the units have been continuously vacant since 06.22.2014.
