Honorable Judge Criss:

On behalf of Court TV Professional—an online video subscription service from Court TV and Courtroom Connect that shows trials of interest to the legal profession—this application is submitted for permission to televise the above proceedings currently scheduled to begin on or around November 6, 2006.

Court TV Professional is a Web-based video service intended to serve legal professionals. It is *not* intended to serve the general public, but rather to allow the professional community to monitor significant civil litigation. Subscribers go to a password-protected Web site to watch testimony, and can also review documents alongside the video when placed into evidence. Trials are covered without commercials or commentary.

Court TV Professional has equipment of a type consistent with the pertinent guidelines. Cameras and microphones are compact, stationary, and require no enhanced lighting. Court TV Professional is ready to cooperate in a pooling arrangement with other media entities whose applications to broadcast the proceedings may also be granted.

We will soon be submitting a Motion and Brief further outlining and distinguishing our request. We request that the Court allow the parties to submit additional briefing on this matter and that an oral hearing be set on this matter at which Court TV Professional and the parties can present oral argument. We ask that such hearing be set anytime between October 15th and November 3rd, or any time prior to the jury being selected that is convenient to the Court .

We would appreciate that any written objections to this request be served upon us and that we be notified of any hearing scheduled regarding Court TV Professional's coverage of this matter.

Finally, if you are interested, we can overnight you a DVD showing how Court TV Professional sets up and operates cameras during a trial.
